#### Greetings and His peace to you!

ALLELUIA! HE IS RISEN!! Not long ago, or .... at least it doesn't seem all that long ago, Sherri and I left the Seminary community and came into your midst. The time had come for me to complete my studies and, God

willing, receive a call to under-shepherd one of His congregations.

We were very eager to see where our wonderful, loving God would send us. Our eagerness mixed together with bit of fear and apprehension at the same time, made for a strange, hard-to-describe emotion. Despite this strange emotion, God kept us grounded and calm as I was called to serve you, our brothers and sisters in Christ here at St. Paul on call day. We traveled with anticipation and ease of step while keeping watch for the devil's schemes. It is a privilege and honor to have been here to grow in faith with you and see what God had in store for us and to move toward it together.

We were initially a bit sad to have left the Stanchfield area to go to Sem, but that faded and was replaced with joy of fellowship and in worship with you. Sherri and I being sent to Seminary and returning to this area is what God's will concluded, just as we pray in the conclusion to the Lord's Prayer, **"For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever."** The kingdom and the power are God's. And so is <u>the will</u> that rules that kingdom and power.

In the conclusion to the Lord's Prayer, we should be certain that the petitions we pray in the Lord's Prayer, please God, our Father in heaven, and that <u>He hears as we pray them</u>. God the Father through Jesus the Christ, His Son, commanded that we pray this way and <u>promised to hear us</u>.

As the Lord's Prayer concludes, we, too, at His direction, had to conclude our time here at St Paul and take another leap of faith to go wherever God would send us, fully knowing and trusting that He would take care of us wherever that might be.

I am very fond of **verse 8** in **Isaiah 6** which ends with the prophet Isaiah answering God's question of who will go by responding: "Here I am! Send me." Even though this is one of my favorite verses and I try very hard to go and do the tasks He has set before me, I still sinfully rebel against Him and His will, often trying to 'force' or 'bend' His will to mine, which is not fruitful nor beneficial to anyone, and above all else, very disrespectful and sinful toward God. Thanks be to Him for His compassion, merciful grace, and forgiveness toward all of us when we ignore or fight against His will in our Fallen-ness!

You, now, together as a congregation, are to move toward another conclusion and the beginning of a new journey. Not one of your own choosing, but one God has set before you. Together, you must run the race and fight the good fight while proclaiming the Gospel that is the Good News of Jesus the Christ until He calls you to Himself or our Savior returns. To stay busy until God's will for His creation is finished and concluded, with all His people in heaven with Him.

The final word of the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer is the word "Amen." And it is fitting that I also conclude, sharing with you that amen means 'so shall it be.'



<u>Did you know?</u>

What is the **Divine Call** that a pastor receives to go and serve a congregation?

The Divine Call can be described in two different ways.

The first way is when God works directly/immediately on a person, like when a person 'feels' him/herself summoned/invited by God to take up the work of ministry. Examples would be when God literally and directly speaks to someone such as in the cases of: Noah, Abraham, Moses, Jacob, many prophets like Elijah and Isaiah, the Disciples, and the Apostle Paul. Another example might be when a person 'feels' God 'pulling' and or 'calling' then into the ministry, such as you might have heard a pastor say or even experienced yourself as the reason for taking part in the proclamation of the Gospel.

The second way, and often the one we talk about most, is an external (or mediate) Call. This is when a parish takes action in electing ('extending the Call')/accepting a man as their pastor. This is certainly done under God's direction and will as He acts through a particular parish to provide for His people at that place with an under-shepherd of His choosing to best serve His people for a time period known only to God. With this type of a Call, the pastor tries not only to discern what God's will for the newly received Call, but also the Call he is currently serving at (except in the case of a graduate just out of Seminary). Please keep all pastors who receive Calls in your prayers as this is often very difficult physically and emotionally, asking God to help them see what His will for them is.
