Greetings and His peace to you!

Shortly, we will be in the season of Advent, and we'll be in the Advent season right until Christmas Eve. That's nearly the whole month of

December. It is right that we should celebrate this season for such a lengthy period of time as without it we wouldn't have forgiveness or salvation.

Hey Pastor, are you sure you aren't talking about Easter? Well, I could be, but in this case no. The word advent is a Latin word that means 'coming.' If Jesus didn't come down and live among us, there would have been no resurrection and no salvation for us. It's the reason we continue to have worship on the 1st day of the week. It is to celebrate the resurrection of our Savior. Each Sunday is a 'mini' Easter celebration. And why shouldn't we celebrate our Savior's victory over sin, death, and the power of the devil? After all, Jesus did it to save God's creation and we're part of that creation. We would be in more than just dire straits without the love and grace we receive from God. But it all started from the very beginning, when God gave His promise to save us. He promised that a THE Messiah would be coming and the Advent season is both to rejoice that He IS come and He will come again on the Last Day to take all believers with Him to heaven! We have received the ultimate forgiveness from God through His Son, Jesus the Christ. God does still want us to confess to Him when we sin. And one of the ways we do is in that part of the Lord's Prayer where we pray, "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Martin Luther, in the Small Catechism calls this the 5th Petition of the Lord's Prayer.

In this request part, we are asking God to NOT look at our sins or deny our prayers because of our sins. Luther continues in the meaning of the 5th

Petition, "We are neither worthy of the things for which we pray, nor have we deserved them, but we ask that He would give them all to us by grace, for we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment. So, we too will sincerely forgive and gladly do good to those who sin against us."

We were born into sin and our fallen human nature prevents us from being in a 'right' relationship with God, and because of that we are not worthy to ask God for anything. With the forgiveness that we have because of Jesus, we are seen as being 'right' with God and we <u>can</u> pray to God with the confidence and joy that only comes with the certainty of forgiveness. You and I were forgiven through Jesus, and God wants us to forgive others in the same way He has forgiven us. This is rightly so as Jesus died and was

raised for **ALL** people. God wants us to forgive as He forgave us and we should because of the grace He has shown to us.

Forgiving another who has sinned against you is never easy. It's hard because of our nature and this is why God gives us the strength to step out of our comfort zone and go to that person to confess and ask for forgiveness, or be the one who is forgiving.

Forgiveness is so important to God that He, in **Matthew 5:23-24**, wants us to "*be reconciled*" with our brother (or sister) *before* making an offering on His altar. Did you catch that? <u>BEFORE</u> making an offering to God! It's that important to Him. God also gave us instructions in **Matthew 18** that tell us how to go about reconciling.

The bottom line is that it's so important to God that He sent His one and only Son here to earth to reconcile us to Him.

Did you know?

What is *trespassing*? Trespassing is a word many of are familiar with, especially now as a major hunting season just ended. The dictionary will have the definition of this word as "to enter unlawfully on the land ('in' for property) of another." While this definition is the one that most of us know and use, there is another.

Trespass, in the Biblically sense, means something much different. The definition of Biblical trespass is *"to actively sin against God."* While that definition might make one ask *'why don't we just say sin and keep it simple?'* That would be a fair question. The 'kind' of sin is kept separate (it is still sin no matter how we classify it) because it is not the same as the 'original sin' that we 'inherited' from Adan and Eve at the Fall.

We say 'trespass' in the Lord's Prayer because Jesus wanted us to recognize/realize that we still sin actively (meaning we *do* sin/act sinfully). The difference being that inherited original sin is <u>passive</u> (not a sinful act) and a trespass is <u>active</u> (is a sinful act that we do/commit).
